Refusal to Enroll by the School of Law

Nothing contained herein or provided elsewhere shall abrogate the School of Law's right to refuse to enroll a student or to discontinue enrollment of a student. A student may be denied continued enrollment at the School of Law, for reasons listed below, but not limited thereto:

- a. failure to pay their tuition or any fees associated therewith;
- b. failure to complete all documents necessary to enrollment or continued enrollment, as determined by the School of Law:
- c. failure to comply with the policies of this Handbook;
- d. disturbing the administration of education at the School of Law;
- e. exhibiting behavior that is threatening, harassing or offensive to other students, staff or faculty of the School of Law; or
- f. demonstrating traits that evince a deficiency in character or fitness to practice law.
